In order to have a fun and productive year in math, we must all follow the rules and expectations in our classroom. These are the expectations I have for you:

Responsibilities

Students are responsible for their own assignments and projects. They are expected to turn in all assignments given on the date they are due. Assignments that are not finished during class time will be expected to be brought home and completed to turn in the next day, along with the regular homework assignment that is given.

Homework

Homework is valuable in that it helps your child establish study habits and self-discipline. It also helps prepare students for class topics and aids in evaluating student progress. Homework will be assigned in math twice weekly on Tuesday and Wednesday. Students are responsible for making up work that is missed when absent from school.

Late Work

Late work will be accepted and will receive a lower grade depending on the length of time from which the assignment was due. All late work must be turned in as soon as possible and placed in the "late" basket in the classroom.

School Supplies

In math class we use colored pencils, markers and glue sticks. If you would like to send these items to school with your child for their individual use you may do that. These items are not necessary. I have all the supplies the students will need here at school, but they are to be shared by other students and not always in the best shape.

Gradebook

In order to help your child stay on task and stay organized with assignments, the district site for Gradebook is available to you. On Gradebook you can check your child's grades and help them see what assignments they are missing. Please take advantage of this tool; it is very helpful and can keep you on the same page as your student and his/her teacher.
